The Realm of Wonder Speaker: Dr. Alec Pridgeon

Dr. Alec Pridgeon was born in 1950 in Dallas, Texas and received his Ph.D. in biology from Florida State University specializing in anatomy and systematics of orchids. He is presently a Sainsbury Orchid Fellow at the Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew, where he specializes in molecular phylogenetics and co-edits and contributes to Genera Orchidacearum, a comprehensive multivolume monograph of the orchid family. Volumes 1-4 of General Orchidacearum have already been published by Oxford University Press, and Volume 5 is in press.

In orchid circles he is perhaps best known as past Editor of the American Orchid Society Bulletin (now titled Orchids) and Founding Editor of the scientific orchid journal, Lindleyana. However, he has also written or cowritten more than 50 scientific articles or book chapters and more than 100 popular articles, co-written and co-directed five videotapes, edited 14 books including the Proceedings of the 14th World Orchid Conference and The Illustrated Encyclopedia of Orchids, and compiled the Orchid Action Plan for the Species Survival Commission of the IUCN in Geneva.

Alec's research interests have taken him throughout Costa Rica as well as to Mexico, Guatemala, Panama, Colombia, Brazil, Ecuador, South Africa, Singapore, Australia, New Zealand, Tonga, Fiji, and New Caledonia. He has been an invited speaker to seven World Orchid Conferences and the 14th International Botanical Congress in Berlin.

Dr. Pridgeon is a Fellow of the Linnean Society of London, Fellow of the American Orchid Society, and Courtesy Curator of the Florida Museum of Natural History. When not studying or photographing plants, he heads for the world's oceans to enjoy scuba diving and underwater photography, particularly of whales and sharks.

President's Message

Just in time, starting this month a board member will be at a table in the rear of the room for the sole purpose of helping newer members gain more from their membership.

Your host will answer your questions and acquaint you with all the "inside" information concerning the Boca Raton Orchid Society, e.g. what is the plant table, how do I enter a plant for judging, how does the raffle table work. Our goal is to assist members in reaping the full benefit of being part of BROS.

One of the more perplexing things about orchids is how they are named. In the next few months, I shall try to acquaint you with some rules of naming. Most names are in Latin, a few are in ancient Greek, and a few keep original names, such as Vanda from India. Latin was chosen because in the era of vast numbers of orchids being registered most collectors were well educated and regardless of nationality spoke Latin.

Rule:

#1: The first letter of the genus is always capitalized, e.g. Cattleya.

#2: The species name is not capitalized, e.g. skinnerii.

#3: Both names are either italicized or underlined,e.g. Cattleya skinnerii orCattleya skinnerii.

August in your Orchid Collection

Tasks for August:

- Finish cutting teretes and reed stem epidendrums early in month
- Reset strap leaf vandas early or not at all
- Dry hard once or twice
- Continue anti fungal spray program
- Apply snail bait lightly twice ten days apart

August Climate Data

Average high: 90.6

Average low: 76.5

Average mean: 83.6

Average rainfall: 8.63"

July and August are the two most similar months in South Florida. Most of the advice on watering, disease and pest control in last month's calendar still apply but subtle changes are taking place. Although it may not seem so, as temperatures climb into the low nineties most afternoons, summer is in retreat: each day a little shorter, each night a little longer. With shorter days the importance of watering as early in the morning as possible comes to the fore. With less hours of sunlight to dry the plants, extra care should be taken in choosing when to water. Back to the basics of the classic saying: If a Vanda looks like it needs water, water it; If a Cattleya or Oncidium looks like it needs water, water it tomorrow. If a Paph or a Phal looks like it needs water, you should have watered it yesterday. Good air circulation and proper watering are the keys to disease prevention.

Those Pesky...... SNAILS

Snails and slugs are a constant problem for outdoor and greenhouse growers of orchids. They love the open medium of bark used for orchids and can cause great damage to new growths



of both roots and plant tops. Most of the time the first sign that there is trouble will be an almost ruined plant, they will invade that fast.

Snail and slug poisons vary by state, so you should consult with your local nursery to determine what is available in your area. Never put slug or snail bait in your orchid pots, always put it around them on the ground as many of the products can be toxic to orchids.
